

A BRIEF HIISTORY OF RADIO SHOWS

The Golden Age of Radio began in the 1920s and lasted until the creation of television in the 1950s. This era brought many new forms of entertainment, including music, talk shows, play-by-play sports, and most notably radio shows.





Radio shows allowed for a new way of experiencing theatre. Without the visual effects that most productions rely on, it highlights the importance of sound in expressing a story.

The first play written specifically for the radio was Richard Hughes *A Comedy of Danger*, airing in 1924.



Sorry, Wrong Tumber

This popular radio show first aired in 1943, starring Agnes Moorehead. She performed several later productions of the play,





The play was later adapted into a film in 1948, and starred Barbara Stanwyck. She went on to perform the original radio play in 1952.

radio series Suspense
received a 1960 Edgar
Award for Best Radio



The Hitchhiker



The Hitchhiker was first broadcasted in 1941 with the Orson Welles Show on CBS Radio.

The play was later adapted into a notable episode of television series *The Twilight Zone* in 1960, starring Kate Jackson.
