

FROM THE DIRECTOR...

There is the modern holiday romantic comedy with all its tropes, a bit of drama, and an "everyone wins in the end" kind of vibe – *Love Actually* (2003). Then there is the Shakespearean holiday romantic comedy with tragic death, cross-dressing, self-discovery and identity, bullying, finding love in an unexpected fashion, and an "everyone wins in the end...except one or two" kind of vibe - *Twelfth Night* (1601). At the end of the film *Shakespeare in Love* (2003), Judi Dench's Queen Elizabeth I says, "tell Master Shakespeare, something more cheerful next time....for Twelfth Night." Yes, it's a comedy of the Elizabethan era, but in many ways, *Twelfth Night* seems more relevant to today's society than a contemporary romantic comedy film.

Historically, Twelfth Night is a Christian holiday (marking the twelfth and final night of the Christmas season, January 6th). In short, it is meant to be a celebration of the "good" things in life. Regardless of religious belief, the play *Twelfth Night* embodies carefree excesses, pranks, buffoonery, and, as 17th century churchman and author Francis Meres put it, "the perplexities of love." Like most of Shakespeare's cannon, the plot of *Twelfth Night* was derived from a previously composed story. In this case, Shakespeare penned his own theatrical spin on a similar plotline by Italian writer, Matteo Bandello. One of the questions asked about the plot (including by my cast!), is why the character of Malvolio is treated with such cruelty. The best answer is that Malvolio is a metaphorical caricature of the late 14th century puritan-leaning London figures, who habitually associated theatres and their plays with lack of chastity and sedition. They wanted theatres to meet their demise. They got their wish forty years after the premiere of *Twelfth Night*, but not before Shakespeare could take a dig at those people and establishments he and his contemporaries did not like.

For this production, I was inspired by the 1995 novel *High Fidelity* by Nick Hornby, and the subsequent 2000 film of the same name, starring John Cusack. Cusack's character possessed a fickle yet passionate nature that aligns with the opening of the play. Not to mention, like Orsino, Cusack's character in *High Fidelity* is not the best at courting a potential partner. As a teen in the 90s, I remember when Nirvana took the world by storm; I remember noticing people highlight and color their hair; and, I remember thinking, I guess it's okay to just be yourself. Musically, the 90s in America (predominately in the Pacific Northwest) offered louder guitars, throaty vocals, and flannel. As a music lover and budding songwriter, what stood out to me was that good, memorable melodies still separated the great bands from the mediocre ones. In comparison, Shakespeare's textual melody can still captivate the ear after all these centuries.

The enchantment of *Twelfth Night* is the characters and their relationships. From groaning over unrequited love to coming to the aid of someone dear, we not only laugh through love's complexities, we feel sympathy and even empathy for characters who must navigate them. As my students have had to navigate the play's complexities, they have grappled with archaic language and had to showcase a variety of skills – physical comedy, musicianship, vocal technique, stamina, etc. I'm very proud of the cast and crew, and I appreciate their trust in me and my dearest colleagues, Jon Ares and Annie Kaiser.

Laugh, cry, sing along, but most of all, enjoy yourself tonight. Thank you for coming.

MUSIC & ARTS PARTNERS: FILLING THE GAP.

Over \$94,000 has helped support the WLHS Performing Arts and auditorium through Music and Arts Partners (MAP) in the past 21 years from grants, direct donations, concession profits and naming of WL Heritage Seats in the auditorium. Recent grants have funded costume design, a new black scrim for the stage, two new acoustic shells, \$750 grant was for a dust collection unit for the scene shop's new table saw to improve student health and safety, and aVoice/dialect/text workshop. Nearly \$230,000 has been received by all WLHS arts programs since 1995.

Funding from WL Heritage Seats donations and from the 2006 Sebastian Challenge, provided extras for the new auditorium. A baby grand piano for the stage, new lighting equipment, follow spots, lobby chimes/monitor, one more choral shell, sound mixing equipment and wireless headsets have been added solely with Heritage Seat funds.

In June 2018, MAP awarded \$5500 in scholarships to graduating seniors in the arts at West Linn HS and Wilsonville HS, which included a \$1000 Morris Family Theatre Scholarship to WLHS senior and Thespian Troupe 1915 Co-President Brady McDevitt. Other WLHS seniors awarded scholarships were Sheridan Hardy (Morris Band), Claire Newrones, Luukas Lemetyinen, Elizabeth Herrick, and Lauren Griffith. Applications for 2019 MAP scholarships will be available on the MAP website and in the WLHS Career Center in winter of 2019.

District-wide, over \$875,000 has been granted by MAP to all 16 schools, to help fill the funding gaps for arts in our schools. A volunteer, non-profit organization, MAP welcomes your support to benefit this school and any other school your children may attend.
